FY2025 OVERVIEW

Campus Services supports student events by awarding its BuzzFunds allocation to registered student organizations and campus departments that seek additional funding to enhance their events and engage with the campus community.

In the 2024–2025 academic year, BuzzFunds supported a total of 110 events, including a record-breaking 39 Week of Welcome programs and four Campus Services Scholarships awarded to outstanding student leaders. This year also marked a pivotal shift in our funding strategy: we updated the BuzzFunds Guidelines to prioritize broader student impact by discontinuing support for closed RSO events with fewer than 50 attendees. As a result, while the total number of funded events decreased, the reach and visibility of BuzzFunds grew significantly. These changes enabled us to support larger, more inclusive events that engaged a wider cross-section of the student body—ensuring that BuzzFunds continues to be a powerful catalyst for campus connection and community.

Collaborating Across Campus

BuzzFunds is a driving force behind some of Georgia Tech's most memorable and unifying student experiences, empowering departments across campus to come together in celebration, support, and school spirit. During Week of Welcome, BuzzFunds helped bring House Party at Bobby Dodd to life—a high-energy kickoff event hosted by the GT Athletics Association that transforms the stadium into a vibrant party space, welcoming thousands of students with music, games, and a powerful sense of Yellow Jacket pride just before the first day of classes. BuzzFunds also fueled the ever-popular Midnight Breakfast, a cherished SCPC tradition where students are treated to late-night pancakes, eggs, and more during finals week—served with a smile by Tech Dining staff and Campus Services administrators who volunteer their time to support students during a stressful season. And when unforeseen challenges arose, BuzzFunds helped turn disruption into opportunity: when a chilled water outage canceled RATS Night, a signature event during Week of Welcome, the GT Campus Recreation team quickly pivoted to create Splash Bash, a poolside celebration planned in under a week that kept the Week of Welcome spirit alive with the support of BuzzFunds.

These events are more than just fun—they're a testament to what's possible when campus partners unite with a shared goal: to create joyful, inclusive, and unforgettable moments that define the Georgia Tech student experience.




Supporting the Strategic Plan

BuzzFunds-supported events this year strongly reflected Georgia Tech's Strategic Plan values. The most frequently supported value was "We nurture the well-being of our community," with 49 events fostering connection, care, and student support. The second most supported value was "We thrive on diversity," with 29 events celebrating and amplifying the diverse voices and experiences on campus. Event Categories Breakdown

To better understand how BuzzFunds supported student engagement this year, we analyzed the event categories selected by planners during the funding request process. The most frequently funded category was Student Life, with 49 events—many of which were part of the record-setting 39 Week of Welcome programs. Culture was the second most popular category, with 36 events that celebrated and highlighted the diversity of our campus community. Campus Services Scholarship



The Campus Services Scholarship celebrates students who have made a remarkable impact on the Institute community through their exceptional leadership, academic excellence, and dedicated service. This prestigious award honors those who have shown a profound and meaningful commitment to fostering a vibrant campus environment and enriching student life through their involvement in various programs, activities, or initiatives. This year, the scholarship recipients were each granted a \$4,000 award to further support their ongoing dedication to the Georgia Tech community.

Scholarship Award Winners

Anu Lal was awarded a scholarship in recognition of her extraordinary leadership, compassion, and commitment to supporting the well-being of her campus community. After joining SMILE, a student organization focused on spreading positivity, she took the initiative to revive and expand a meaningful event in collaboration with VOICE during Sexual Assault Awareness Month. When initial plans for the event were declined due to limited resources, she independently secured funding and organized the event, ensuring its success. She introduced a new approach by distributing 500 painted teal rocks with messages of support across campus, making the initiative more inclusive and accessible. Her determination transformed VOICE Rocks into an annual tradition that continues to uplift and support students across Georgia Tech.





Lauren "Vic" Paulson was recognized with a scholarship for her impactful leadership and dedication to enhancing student life through the arts at Georgia Tech. As Open House Chair and Director of DramaTech Theatre's mainstage production She Kills Monsters, she played a pivotal role in building community and fostering creativity on a predominantly STEM-focused campus. Under her direction, over 100 students—including many first-time participants—contributed to the production, which culminated in sold-out final performances. Her efforts helped make the arts more accessible and welcoming, enriching the campus experience for a diverse range of students.

Campus Services Scholarship Award Winners



Jasmine Brown was recognized with a scholarship for her exceptional dedication to student success and career development through her role as an Undergraduate Career Peer Advisor at the Georgia Tech Career Center. She has been instrumental in expanding access to career resources by leading workshops, offering individualized advising, and introducing after-hours virtual appointments to accommodate students with busy schedules. Her standout initiative—a virtual workshop on securing international internships—drew over 200 participants, marking one of the highest turnouts for a student-led Career Center event. Through her efforts, Jasmine has created a more inclusive, accessible, and supportive environment for students navigating their professional journeys.

Jaila Kimbro is being recognized for her outstanding leadership and dedication to STEM outreach as the Pre-Collegiate Initiative Chair for the Georgia Tech Society of Black Engineers. She successfully led the planning and execution of PCI Day, the chapter's largest K–12 STEM outreach event, which brought middle and high school students from underrepresented backgrounds to campus for a day of hands-on learning and mentorship. Her initiative secured \$6,000 in funding to provide STEM kits for each student, extending the impact of the event beyond the day itself. Her efforts exemplify a strong commitment to fostering a more inclusive and diverse STEM community.

Sting Break


